MINUTES September 4, 2025

The Bushkill Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting on Thursday, September 4, 2025, in the Bushkill Township Municipal Meeting Room. The following Supervisors were present: Mrs. Bender, Mrs. Hill, Mr. Knauss, Mr. Kocher, and Mr. Smith. Also present at the meeting were Solicitor Gary Asteak, Township Engineer Robert Collura, Chief McLouth, Public Works Director Peter Yotter, Zoning Officer Todd Weidman and Open Space Coordinator Kerry Reider. There were 11 people in the audience.

The Chairman, Brien Kocher called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

- 16. Regulations of Burial Practices Request Chairman Kocher stated that a request has been made regarding the Regulation of Burial Practices. The request had been referred to Solicitor Asteak for review. Solicitor Asteak in his letter dated August 11, 2025, As Township Solicitor, I have been asked to advise the Board of Supervisors on whether the Township can regulate how human remains are buried in local cemeteries. Unless a specific burial practice creates a clear threat to public health, safety, or welfare, the Township should not attempt to regulate burial methods, especially regarding caskets or vaults. Doing so could expose the Township to constitutional challenges. (Full letter from Solicitor Asteak dated August 11, 2025, included as part of the minutes)

RE: Township Regulation of Burial Practices

Dear Board of Supervisors:

As the Township Solicitor I have been directed to provide the Board of Supervisors with guidance with regard to whether a Township may regulate the manner in which human remains are buried in cemeteries located within the Township. The Second Class Township Code specifically provides the Board of Supervisors may by Ordinance make rules and regulations regarding the location, operation and maintenance of cemeteries in the Township. If a cemetery is abandoned, the Second Class Township Code provides for procedures to regulate and remove leaves, refuse and debris. (See Section 1536 of the Second Class Township Code).

The Bushkill Township Zoning Ordinance addresses cemeteries as a use and the permissible locations thereof. There is a wealth of legislation adopted by the Commonwealth addressing and regulating cemeteries, burial practices, funeral practices, and other aspects of disposal of human remains.

Note that there is a distinction between the operation of cemeteries and the disposal of human remains from a health, safety, and welfare perspective. Neither State nor Federal law requires the use of a vault or casket. In fact, burial practices are largely left to religious practices and for that reason the government has not deemed it appropriate to regulate burial practices or the requirements for vaults or caskets. For the Township to meddle in an individual's freedom of religion burial practices would be violative of the freedom of religion provisions contained in both the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

If burial in the absence of a casket or vault posed a threat to health, safety, and welfare, as long as said burial occurs as regulated and prescribed by State Statute, it ought not be the subject of municipal regulation. It is believed that any municipality in Pennsylvania that seeks to do so would be the subject of Constitutional challenge.
